Must follow regulations issued by the Prime Minister Office

Hardly any discussions among the purchasing officers in different departments

ISSUES IN PROCUREMENT (1)

Procurement process is not suitable for the present age to cope with the electronic commodities

Inability to develop neutral specifications for purchasing IT equipment leading to cancellation of purchasing process

ISSUES IN PROCUREMENT (2)

Difficulty in evaluating IT consulting firms
Difficulty in tracking companies who have previously ignored and deserted the awarded contracts

Difficulty in judging and scoring the proposals

New concepts

- Has been discussed in NITC and NECTEC
- Waiting for a clear policy from the Government
- Need to have a law to protect electronic contamination
- Need to have cooperation from all concerned


- IT and internet are necessary
